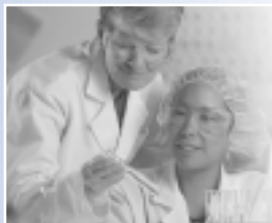

Dear Colleague,

The USIDNET, an NIH-sponsored national consortium to promote the study of primary immunodeficiency, has established a new program entitled **“Short Term Training Program in Primary Immunodeficiency”**. This program is targeted toward young physicians interested in research and management of primary immunodeficiency.

Senior medical students and recent medical graduates in residencies or research fellowships are invited to apply for a one or two week rotation at a center or hospital with a program in primary immunodeficiency. We are seeking applicants who do not have a clinical program in primary immunodeficiency at their home institution.

A stipend of \$2,000 for one week and \$3,000 for two weeks will be awarded for travel and living expenses, and a \$500 stipend for the sponsoring institution.

Interested applicants will fill out a brief application form, and if chosen, will select from a list of hospitals or centers that can provide this educational experience.
